

FREE MEAL POLICY STATEMENT
FOR
THE SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN

1. State of Hawaii, Department of Defense, Hawaii National Guard
Name of Sponsor

Definition of Income

"Income", as the term is used in this notice, is similar to that defined in the Bureau of the Census report, "Characteristics of the Low-Income Population: 1971." "Income" means income before deduction for income taxes, employees' social security taxes, insurance premiums, bonds, etc. It includes the following:

(1) Monetary compensation for services, including wages, salary, commissions or fees; (2) net income from non-farm self-employment; (3) net income from farm self-employment; (4) social security; (5) dividends or interest on savings or bonds, income from estates or trusts, or net rental income; (6) public assistance or welfare payments; (7) unemployment compensations; (8) government civilian employee, or military retirement, or pensions or veteran's payments; (9) private pensions or annuities; (10) alimony or child support payments; (11) regular contributions from persons not living in the household; (12) net royalties; and (13) other cash income. Other cash income would include cash amounts received or withdrawn from any source including savings, investments, trust accounts, and other resources which would be available to pay the price of a child's meal.

"Income," as the term is used in this notice, does not include any income or benefits received under any Federal program which are excluded from consideration as income by a legislative prohibition, for example, income received by volunteers for services performed in the National Older American Volunteer Program.

In determining eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk, school food authorities may use either the family's income during the past 12 months or the family's current rate of income, whichever is the better indication of the family's need.
